

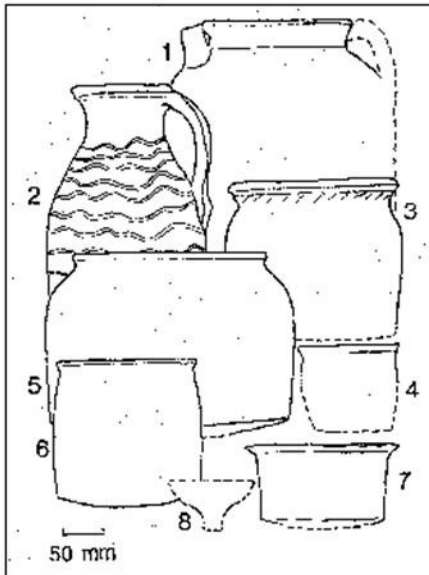
Potters Marston Ware

This major Leicestershire kiln operated from AD c.1100 to c.1300 and it accounts for about 45-60% of the pottery from excavations in Leicester.

There are often many sherds of this ware to be found in Leicestershire fields. This allows us to understand trade and distribution patterns at that time.



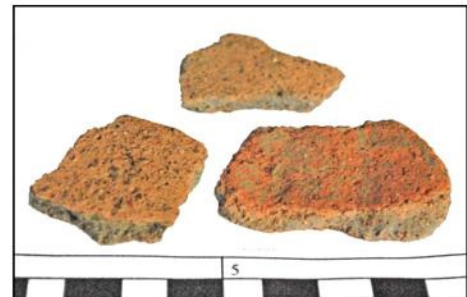
Three Views of a Potters Marston Jug
